

Mr Bates vs The Post Office Monday-Thursday, 9pm 27th-30th May ITV3

This drama tells the story of one of the greatest miscarriages of justice in British legal history and its effect on hundreds of subpostmasters and postmistresses.

When hundreds of innocent victims were accused of theft, fraud and false accounting due to a defective IT system, many of the wronged workers were prosecuted and lives irreparably ruined until one group of subpostmasters took the decision to fight back.



The Thief, His Wife and the Canoe Monday-Thursday, 10pm 27th-30th May ITV3

Four-part drama series based on real events involving John and Anne Darwin, a couple who are plagued by debt and come up with a scheme to solve their problems.

When John decides to fake his own death using his canoe, his wife is horror-stricken but plays along with the plan - its success sees the couple then start to prepare for a new life together in Panama, but one photograph of the pair causes the whole plot to unravel.









Champions Cup Rugby Final: Toulouse v Leinster Saturday, 2pm 25th May ITV4

Hugh Woozencroft is joined by Jamie Roberts, Benjamin Kayser, and Topsy Ojo as the two most successful Champions Cup teams - Leinster and Toulouse - face off.

Five-time winners Toulouse and four-time winners Leinster will clash at the Tottenham Hotspur Stadium with James Lowe, Antoine Dupont, Blair Kinghorn and Jack Willis due to feature - commentary comes from Miles Harrison, David Flatman, and Gordon D'Arcy.
